☐ Weaning Puppies	3 1/2 - 4 1/2 weeks pups may start weaning. Make gruel by mixing milk replacer in puppy food and place it in a flat saucer or plate. As the puppies lap, they will ingest the food. The amount of moisture should be decrteased daily until they are eating dry food with little or no moisture added (usually by four to six weeks)		
☐ Dewormer	Talk to your vet about when a good time is to start them on a dewormer. Usually this is started by week 3-4 and done every other week until the puppies are ready t go home.
